August 23, 2021

The Mayor and City Council met in open session, Monday, August 23, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall. The following officers and members were present: Mayor Linda Crooks-via audio conferencing; Council members Lance Otto, Kevin Klinginsmith-via audio conferencing, Danny Brewer, Marvin Humphreys, Robert Romesburg-via audio conferencing, David Mlika, Duane Urich and John Dolan-via audio conferencing; City Attorney, Tara Walker; City Administrator, Ron Urton; Police Chief, Rex Ross and City Clerk, Cindy Simpson.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND PRAYER

At this time, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. A prayer followed the pledge.

MINUTES

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Otto that the minutes of August 9, 2021 be passed. Motion carried.

BILLS

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that all duly obligated bills for the city be paid. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Reports were given by Brandon Gibler and Kenny Roberts concerning the Assistance to Firefighters Grant. The city match is \$6,400 and is budgeted. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika to accept the grant. Motion carried.

Reports were given by Councilmember Mlika for the Building and Nuisance Board and the Utility Committee.

City Administrator Urton handed out his report.

PUBLIC HEARING-Setting the 2021 tax levy

City Clerk Simpson explained how the tax levy is figured. This year's tax is \$.9816 general fund and \$.1806 for the park fund. No comments were received.

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Otto that Bill No. 30 be introduced, AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE RATE OF THE LEVY UPON ALL THE REAL

ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI FOR THE YEAR 2021 UPON ALL THE PROPERTY TAXABLE WITHIN SAID CITY, which was read. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that Bill No. 30 be passed to the second reading placed upon final passage and voted on. Motion carried. A copy of Bill No. 30 was made available for public inspection prior to this meeting by being posted at City Hall on August 20, 2021. The following vote was taken. Ayes: Otto, Klinginsmith, Brewer, Humphreys, Romesburg, Mlika, Urich and Dolan. Said bill was declared duly passed, numbered Ordinance No. 2021-30, signed and approved by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

BILL NO. 31

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Otto that Bill No. 31 be introduced, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI APPROVING AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI AND MID-WEST INJECTION, FOR THE REMOVAL, TRANSPORTATION AND DISPOSAL OF LIME SLUDGE AT THE CITY'S WATER TREATMENT FACILITY, IN THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE THE SAME BY AND ON BEHALF OF SAID CITY, which was read. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that Bill No. 31 be passed to the second reading placed upon final passage and voted on. Discussion was held. Motion carried. A copy of Bill No. 31 was made available for public inspection prior to this meeting by being posted at City Hall on August 20, 2021. The following vote was taken. BILL NO. 32

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Otto that Bill No. 32 be introduced, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI APPROVING A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI AND ASPLUNDH TREE EXPERT, LLC FOR TRIMMING OF TREES AROUND ELECTRIC LINES IN THE CITY OF TRENTON AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI, TO EXECUTE THE SAME BY AND ON BEHALF OF SAID CITY, which was read. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that Bill No. 32 be passed to the second reading placed upon final passage and voted on. Discussion was held. Motion carried. A copy of Bill No. 32 was made available for public inspection prior to this meeting by being posted at City Hall on August 20, 2021. The following vote was taken. Ayes: Brewer, Humphreys, Romesburg, Mlika, Urich, Dolan, Otto and Klinginsmith. Said bill was

declared duly passed, numbered Ordinance No. 2021-32, signed and approved by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-2

Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Otto that Resolution No. 2021-2 be introduced, A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TRENTON, MISSOURI SUPPORTING AN APPLICATION BY MDL DEVELOPMENT COMPANY, A MISSOURI CORPORATION, D. KIM LINGLE, PRESIDENT, FOR MISSOURI HOUSING DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION FUNDING FOR SENIOR HOUSING AT TRENTON SENIOR VILLAS, which was read. Motion by Councilmember Brewer second by Councilmember Mlika that Resolution No. 2021-2 be passed for adoption. Motion carried. A copy of Resolution No. 2021-2 was made available for public inspection prior to this meeting by being posted at City Hall on August 20, 2021. The following vote was taken. Ayes: Humphreys, Romesburg, Mlika, Urich, Dolan, Otto, Klinginsmith and Brewer. Said resolution was declared duly passed, numbered Resolution No. 2021-2, signed and approved by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

NEW BUSINESS

The TDIA came and asked the City if they would approve an ordinance for social district in the downtown area to allow open containers just during their festivals. Megan Taul said they only have 5 or 6 events. City Attorney Walker said she will bring something back to the council.

City Attorney Walker passed out a portable restroom lease agreement between the City and Black Silo. City Attorney Walker said we need to run it by the other stake holders and make sure it is ok with them.

Discussion was held concerning the preliminary engineering report for the Trenton water treatment system. Tyler Shoemaker with Allstate Consultants said this needs to be sent into DNR and make sure they approve it first. City Administrator Urton discussed the rates for the project. Motion by Councilmember Mlika second by Councilmember Urich to send the PER to DNR for their approval. Motion carried.
